SESSION DETAILS

PROMOTING THE PUBLIC INTEREST | 10:15 - 11:00 (PIGOTT)

This plenary session will position access to reliable knowledge and information as an essential human right and a public good. As we prepare to discuss how best to safeguard the public interest throughout the day, panelists will lay the foundation by exploring what constitutes a digital public good as well as related issues such as diminishing trust in the information landscape, the value of humans in the creation, curation and moderation of content, and the impact of Generative AI on information integrity.

CASE STUDIES IN TRANSFORMATIVE USE | 11:00 - 11:30 (PIGOTT)

One of the key drivers for this summit is the urgent need to protect information integrity and sustainability. We will hear about the impact of AI crawlers and other forms of large-scale digital reuse on content platforms and their infrastructure, as well as some of the wider ethical issues related to Generative AI. This session highlights some of the ways in which reuse fuels innovation, creativity and scientific progress. Three transformative use cases of AI and open data within different sectors will be highlighted to inspire reflections and conversations throughout the rest of the summit.

PARALLEL SESSION 1 | 12:00 - 13:00

ADVOCATING FOR CHANGE | PIGOTT

This session brings together diverse voices that are driving advocacy initiatives to build a digital future grounded in public goods - shared resources like open data, free knowledge platforms, and open-source tools that allow everyone to learn, create, and participate. Speakers will share how they lead campaigns from national policy efforts to grassroots movements and creative activism

BUILDING AN INCLUSIVE INTERNET | BRONTË

This panel will dive into the human labor required to develop an inclusive, multilingual internet that reflects the world's full range of knowledge and experience. From the people who label data and moderate content to those who digitize archives or nurture small language communities online, inclusion requires intention. The conversation will reveal how real people are working to create an internet where no single language, culture, or worldview dominates.

AI FOR OPEN KNOWLEDGE: CHALLENGES & INSIGHTS | PIGOTT

The demand for human created knowledge has grown exponentially with the rise of AI, at times causing an unsustainable increase in automated traffic for the websites that host such content. This talk will explore how these evolving dynamics impact the Wikimedia Foundation's technical infrastructure. A cross-sector panel will then share their experiences and the similarities in the same trends manifesting in their industries.

GROWING UP WITH AI | BRONTË

This panel explores what it means to "grow up with AI" — from how generative technologies influence the content young people see, to the skills and safeguards needed to navigate this new information landscape responsibly. Panellists will discuss how to foster digital resilience, ensure transparency and accountability in AI systems, and balance innovation with the protection of rights and democratic values.

NESTA WORKSHOP ON 'AI SOCIAL READINESS PROCESS' | ELLIOTT

Join Nesta's <u>Centre for Collective Intelligence</u> for an interactive demo session of their "Public AI Task Force," a participatory process designed to involve the public in decisions about AI tools for the public sector. During this time, you'll act as a general member of the UK public and step into the shoes of a Public AI Task Force member, working with fellow participants to explore an AI tool designed to improve public services. This highly practical demo will provide an example of what it looks like to promote the public interest in a tangible scenario.

VALUING OPEN SCIENCE & CULTURE | 15:10 - 16:00 | PIGOTT

This session explores how institutions can continue to champion openness in science and culture to ensure that knowledge remains transparent, accessible, and equitable in an AI-driven world. Leaders from research, science and culture will consider what "value" means in this new ecosystem: how open science and open culture contribute to innovation, accountability, and global collaboration; how openness can coexist with ethical, commercial, and privacy concerns; and how institutions can adapt their practices to sustain openness in the age of algorithmic mediation. Together, they'll explore how to articulate and strengthen the case for openness as a public good—ensuring that open science and culture continue to serve as cornerstones of an informed, inclusive, and creative society.

KNOWLEDGE IS HUMAN | 16:00 - 16:30 | PIGOTT

In this concluding session we come back to the main idea of the summit - human-created, open knowledge in the age of AI - with the examples of Wikimedia projects and British Library's expertise in crowdsourced cultural heritage. Just as AI works at scale, we reflect on the scalable potential of open knowledge and human knowledge production. This session considers both the current state of play, and what may be coming on the horizon.
